LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

I was listening to the radio in my car today and in the middle of November they are already playing Christmas music! It's not even Thanksgiving yet, and now they have switched over to Christmas songs! Again...am I complaining? No. For me, this is another reminder that we have entered our culture's season of holidays. And who doesn't love a holiday?

Well, God seems to love them. In Leviticus 23, God establishes The Festival of Trumpets, The Day of Atonement, and The Festival of Tabernacles as holidays for his people. Some of these are pretty cool. For The Festival of Tabernacles, you had to live in "temporary shelters" for 7 days. It's like a week-long camping trip!

In Esther 9:19-22, after God used Esther to save the Jewish people from the genocide planned for them by Hamon, God set up a two-day holiday (Adar) during which God's people celebrated by feasting and giving each other gifts (It sounds like our version of Christmas). There are many more examples of God giving his people holidays to celebrate. I think it is safe to say that God likes holidays and intends for us to enjoy them.

But, there is one caveat. Every holiday that we chose to celebrate should be celebrated to God's glory. In Nehemiah 8:9-10, the prophet Ezra reminded God's people that when we celebrate, we must dedicate our holidays to God.

I look forward to doing that again this season. Our holiday season continues with 'Christ the King Sunday' on November 24th. Then, there is the 'hanging the greens' on Saturday, Nov 30th. All are invited to come to the church and help decorate for Advent. After that, on Dec 1st we kick off the Advent as we celebrate our Savior, Jesus Christ. Second Advent is Dec 8th, and Third Advent is Dec 15th.

December 15th is also our much anticipated 'Birthday for Jesus' celebration. This will be after church at noon. Remember to bring a \$15 white elephant gift for each person that is playing the game. Wrap your gift but do not label who it is to or from. Food is provided (usually pizza!).

Dec 22nd is fourth Advent. We tie up the Advent with a very special Christmas Eve service on Dec 24th at 8:00 p.m. Please join us if you are able as we light the Christ Candle and remember Jesus by joining Him in Holy Communion. See you there.

Ah! Let us praise God for the holidays. We are blessed that he has given such marvelous ones to us. May Christ be glorified in each and every one.
